FIRST AID

Policy statement

In our setting we aim to provide good quality health care when necessary (Article 24 U.N.C.R.C). Staff are able to take action to apply first aid treatment in the event of an accident involving a child or adult. At least one member of staff with current first aid training is on the premises or on an outing at any one time. The first aid qualification includes paediatric first aid training for infants and young children.

The nominated First Aider (s) is/are: KERRY GOODWIN, CLARE RAWLINGS, JO ANTELL, VICKY BLAGDEN, AMANDA RENNIE, AMY CLARK, KAREN MILBORROW

He/she will ensure that the First Aid box is kept well stocked is checked and refilled every half term.

The nominated First Aider (s) will attend an appropriate course every 3 years so as to ensure they remain up-to-date on first aid methods.

Procedures

The First Aid Kit

- Our First Aid kit comprises with the Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981.
- The first aid box is easily accessible to adults and is kept out of the reach of children.
- No un-prescribed medication is given to children, parents or staff.
- At the time of admission to the setting, parents' written permission for emergency medical advice or treatment is sought. Parents sign and date their written approval.
- The nominated First Aider will ensure a written note is made of any accidents in the accident book and that parents sign against this when collecting children to confirm they have been informed.
